### PSBU Interventional Programmes to Mitigate Under Performance

PSBU has implemented a range of programs and initiatives aimed at supporting students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds to ensure they successfully complete their studies. These efforts focus on both academic and personal development to address the specific challenges faced by students from low-income families.

One of the key initiatives is the regular **weekend workshops** that focus on enhancing students' **English language skills, communication skills, and study skills**. These workshops are essential for helping students improve their academic performance, especially those who may have had limited exposure to English and higher-level study skills before entering university.

PSBU also benefits from **peripatetic Native English-Speaking teachers** who visit the campus to provide specialized English instruction. This additional academic support allows students to improve their language proficiency, which is crucial for their overall academic success, especially for students from rural areas where access to quality English education is limited.

In addition to academic support, PSBU offers **counseling and student guidance services**. These services are designed to help students navigate personal, social, and academic challenges, providing them with the emotional support needed to stay focused on their education.

The university also has a **mentor program** in place, where more experienced students or faculty members provide ongoing guidance and support to students from low-income backgrounds. This mentorship program helps students build confidence, manage their studies effectively, and develop important life skills that contribute to their long-term success.

Through these targeted programs and initiatives, PSBU ensures that students from the lowest income groups receive the support they need to overcome barriers and achieve their academic goals. These efforts directly align with **SDG 1: No Poverty**, as PSBU is actively working to



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reduce inequality by empowering students from disadvantaged backgrounds to succeed in higher education.
