

- To invite His Holiness to the episcopal ordination ceremony for Bishop Silas Suon Hangsly.
- His Holiness was delighted with the proposal, warmly receiving it with compassion and goodwill. He stated that:
- Buddhism and Christianity share a good relationship that contributes to harmony in Cambodia.
- It is essential to foster deep and lasting unity between the two religions.
- He recalled his very close and friendly history with His Excellency Schmitthaeusler from 15 years ago.









His Excellency Schmitthaeusler also presented a copy of the book from the 8th International Interreligious Dialogue between Buddhism and Christianity to His Holiness. The book, on the theme of "Working Together to Sustain Religious Harmony with Resilience," was placed in the Techo Santepheap Library as a memento.

Following the meeting, His Holiness Bour Kry, accompanied by His Excellency Schmitthaeusler and other senior monks and officials, toured several facilities at Wat Svay Pope. The tour included the nine-story Somdech Preah Moha Sangreach Bour Kry educational building, the three-story Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padei Techo Hun Sen educational building, the health center named after His Royal Highness Preah Moha Sangreach Bour Kry Preah Karuna Preah Bat Samdech Preah Boromneath Norodom Sihamoni, and the Samdech Techo Santepheap dormitory.

During the tour, His Holiness and His Excellency discussed the progress and harmony of religious beliefs, practices, education, healthcare, and cooperation between the two faiths. They stressed the importance of promoting both religions in a sustainable, inclusive, and vibrant way in Cambodia, in line with the government's Pentagonal Strategy under the wise leadership of Prime Minister Hun Manet.

BESTOWS ROYAL GIFTS ON MANAGEMENT. MONASTIC OFFICIALS, CIVIL SERVANTS, MEDICAL TEAMS. WORKING GROUPS, AND STUDENTS AT THE TECHO SANTIPHEAP DORMITORY



On the afternoon of Thursday, August 21, 2025, Supreme Patriarch Samdech Preah Mahasangharajah Bour Kry, Rector of Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University and Chairman of the Samdech Royal Master Bour Kry Health Post of His Majesty King Norodom Sihamoni and His Excellency Ngoun Sdechpheakdey, a personal advisor to Samdech Moha Borvor Thipadei Hun Manet, the Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia, and Secretary of State for Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University, as well as other excellencies, bestowed and distributed gifts to the management committee, civil servants, medical teams, working groups, and students residing in the Techo Santipheap Dormitory. During his royal address, the Supreme Patriarch delivered a profound message, emphasizing three key points:

- On Compassion: He stated that human beings survive through food and compassion. A compassionate heart is ever-fresh, like the unwavering love of parents for their children, or the dedicated kindness of teachers who seek to cultivate knowledge in their students to help them become valuable human capital for society. He added that when a society is compassionate towards its people, peace and happiness will prevail.
- On Gratitude: He stressed the importance of gratitude towards benefactors. As human beings, we must be grateful and repay the kindness shown to us by our parents, teachers, and all philanthropists.

3. On Social Virtues (Sangkaha Dhamma):

He explained that we must practice the four social virtues (Sangkaha Dhamma) taught by the Buddha. These virtues are essential for a harmonious society and for helping one another, as we cannot live alone. The four virtues are:

- Dana: The act of giving or sharing, whether through material donations or by spreading happiness to others.
- · Piyavaca: The use of kind, pleasant, and loving speech that is delightful to hear.
- Atthachariya: Conducting oneself in a way that brings benefit to both oneself and others.
- · Samanattata: Maintaining an equal, honest, and humble demeanor, which earns the respect of others.

Following his address, the highly revered Supreme Patriarch graciously presented gifts to a total of 281 monks and individuals. Each person received a 25kg bag of rice, a box of instant noodles, and a cash donation of 20,000 Riels.

The Supreme Patriarch then proceeded to inspect the Techo Santipheap Dormitory building, accompanied by His Excellency Ngoun Sdechpheakdey, other officials, and the students residing there, all expressing their utmost faith and devotion.

MR. KHIM DARATH HOSTS SAMUEL ANG, THE REGIONAL DIRECTOR FOR ASIA AT QUACQUARELLI SYMONDS (QS)

On Tuesday morning, August 26, 2025, Mr. Khim Darath, Head of the Office of International Relations and Permanent Vice President of the Graduate School at Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University, hosted a visit by Mr. Samuel Ang, the Regional Director (Asia) of Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) from Singapore.

Representing His Excellency Ngoun Sdechpheakdey, an advisor to Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Manet and Secretary of State for the Ministry of Cults and Religion, Mr. Khim Darath, along with Venerable Sam Sovasna, Dean of the Faculty of Information Technology, led the university's management and officials in welcoming the guest.

During their meeting, Mr. Darath and Mr. Ang discussed cooperation to strengthen their partnership and improve the quality of education at the university to meet international standards. Mr. Darath presented the university's vision, mission, history, and achievements in its three main areas of service: education, healthcare, and social welfare for monks, students, and underprivileged citizens. He highlighted the leadership of His Holiness Bour Kry and the university's alignment with the policies of the Royal Government's 7th mandate, led by Prime Minister Hun Manet.

KHIM DARATH LEADS MEETING ON THE 2025 ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAM



On Wednesday, September 3, 2025, Mr. Khim Darath, Head of the Office of International Relations and Permanent Vice President of the Postgraduate School at Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University, chaired a meeting to discuss the "2025

Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University College Entrepreneurial Business Model Competition." He represented His Excellency Ngoun Sdechpheakdey, personal advisor to Prime Minister Hun Manet and Secretary of State of the Ministry of Cult and Religion, who is in charge of the university.



The meeting began with Mr. Kong Sophy presenting the agenda, which covered three main topics: 1. Preparation for the competition day: 1. This included organizing the Preah Sihanouk Raja Buddhist University College Entrepreneurial Business Model Competition. 2. Competition process: This outlined the operational procedures for the event. 3. Roles and responsibilities: This defined the duties of the evaluation committee and assistant trainers.

Mr. Khim Darath emphasized that in today's competitive world, it is crucial to create and develop new businesses to solve economic problems for individuals, families, communities, and the nation. He stressed the importance of training and encouraging students to develop innovative and practical business ideas. He announced that the competition will be held from September 8-11, 2025, and will be divided into three key stages: university, national, and international.





The meeting, attended by administrators and officials, focused on the launch of the competition, which is set to begin on Monday, September 8, 2025. Other notable attendees included Dr. Khat Bora, Director General of Christina's Beauty School and a

professor at the university, as well as Mr. Kong Sophy, Head of the university's Entrepreneurship Project. The evaluation committee, assistant trainers, and eight other team members from the Office of International Relations were also present.



Mr. Darath also highlighted that this event marks a new milestone for the university, aiming to instill business knowledge and entrepreneurial skills in students. The competition will provide a platform for students to: Learn entrepreneurial skills, Present creative business ideas, build networks with students, professors, and entrepreneurial experts, Connect with investors and business owners. Dr. Khat Bora provided a presentation on the roles and responsibilities of the evaluation committee and assistant trainers. He outlined the key stages of the competition:

- 1. Application: Announcing the project and receiving student applications.
- Training: Providing instruction on Business Plans, Marketing Strategy, and creating quality products and services.
- 3.Exhibition: All teams will showcase their business ideas and products.
- 4. Evaluation: The committee will assess submissions based on criteria such as innovation, practicality, outcomes, and social benefits.

The meeting concluded at 10:30 AM, successfully finalizing the agenda and preparations for the upcoming "2025 Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University College Entrepreneurial Business Model Competition.

PSBU Unipreneur Business Model Competition 2025 at Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University




On September 8, 2025, His Excellency Nguon Sdechpheakdey, Personal Advisor to Samdech Moha Bovor Tipadei Hun Manet, Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia and Secretary of State of Ministry of Cult and Religion in Charge of Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University under the auspices of His Holiness Samdech Preah Mahasangharajah Bour Kry, Rector of Preah Sihamoniraja University and President of Samdech Royal Master Bour Kry Health Post of His Majesty King Sihamoni, together with Ms. Krech Sreynang, an expert in entrepreneurship and innovation at Khmer Enterprises and representative of Cambodian entrepreneurs, presided over the opening ceremony of PSBU Unipreneur Business Model Competition 2025 at Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University. The event took place at Vimean Santepheap Hall with the participation of university management, leadership, professors, officials, lecturers evaluation committee members, mentors, distinguished speakers, and students of Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University.

To begin the ceremony, Mr. Khim Darath, Head of International Relations Office and Permanent Deputy President of Postgraduate School of Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University, delivered a welcome speech and presented a report on the "of PSBU Unipreneur Business Model Competition 2025" at Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University, with the following key points:

(1) The student participants included 130 students from General Management major, divided into teams of 5 members each. (2) The program was divided into three stages: A - September 8-11, 2025, training and business idea presentations; B - October 1, 2025, semi-final round to select 10 teams; C - October 2-3, 2025, final round to select 3 winning teams. (3) Prizes awarded included: A-the first-place team received \$900 in funding to support their business venture; B - the second-place team received \$700; and C - the third-place team received \$500. Mr. Khim Darath also mentioned the expected outcomes of the program: (1) students will gain courage and creativity in generating and publicly presenting business ideas; (2) students will gain access to public business networks; (3) students will be able to compete with teams from other universities; and (4) the university's entrepreneurship teams will be strengthened and prepared to compete at the national level. He further stated that this event marks the first entrepreneurship business model competition organized by Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University, in collaboration with Khmer Enterprises and the Department of General Management of Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University.



Following that, Ms. Krech Sreyneanng delivered remarks and presented a report from Khmer Enterprises, which included: (1) Khmer Enterprises focuses on four sectors: A – information technology; B – agriculture; C – services; and D – manufacturing. (2) Four core program initiatives include: A – promoting an entrepreneurial culture; B – entrepreneurship development programs; C – building business networks; and D – market and financial access. (3) Over the past five years, Khmer Enterprises has implemented 403 entrepreneurship-related programs. Ms. Krech Sreyneang emphasized that Khmer Enterprises was established five years ago and has actively contributed to the development of Cambodia's entrepreneurial ecosystem.



In conclusion, His Excellency Nguon Sdechpheakdey, Ms. Krech Sreyneang, together with university administration, leadership, professors, honorary guest speakers, evaluation committee members, and mentors, officially opened the "PSBU Unipreneur Business Model Competition 2025 at Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University" at Santepheap Hall located in 3th floor at Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University in a joyful and celebratory atmosphere











COLLEGE ENTREPRENEUR BUSINESS MODEL

On the morning of Monday, September 8, 2025, Dr. Khat Bora, Director of the Cristina School of Aesthetics and a professor at Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University, gave a presentation on business model concepts to students. The presentation was part of the "2025 Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University College Entrepreneur Business Model Competition."

The four-day event, held from September 8-11, took place in Independence Hall on the 9th floor of the Samdech Preah Moha Sangkhareach Bour Kry building. The event was attended by university management, professors, government officials, the evaluation committee, assistant teachers, guest speakers, and students from the university.

Over the four-day period, Dr. Khat Bora presented on the following topics: Problem identification, Solution development, Customer analysis, Competitor analysis, SWOT analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats), Business concept planning using the SCAMPER method, The 4Ps of marketing strategy, Business models, Product and prototype development, Analysis and identification of business resources, Revenue streams and budget planning, Business plans, A mock business model competition.

Dr. Khatt Bora emphasized that when creating a business plan, it is crucial to conduct detailed and thorough research regarding customer problems and solutions, as well as a complete analysis of target customers and competitors. He stated that entrepreneurs must clearly define their target customers, identify their problems, and create appropriate and unique solutions to achieve business success.

Furthermore, Dr. Bora stressed that entrepreneurs must have a clear understanding of their revenue sources and how to generate income. He highlighted several key concepts:

- The SCAMPER method for business concepts, which includes: 1-Substitute,
 2-Combine, 3-Adapt, 4-Modify, 5-Put to other uses, 6-Eliminate, and
 7-Rearrange/Reverse.
- . The 4Ps marketing strategy: 1-Product, 2-Price, 3-Place, and 4-Promotion.
- The four core features of a business model: 1-Value Proposition, 2-Customer Segments, 3-Channels, and 4-Key Partners.
- The three levels of product and prototype development: 1-Low Fidelity,
 2-Medium Fidelity, and 3-High Fidelity.
- The four key business resources: 1-Human resources, 2-Financial resources,
 3-Physical resources, and 4-Intellectual resources.

Additionally, Dr. Khat Bora clarified the four key elements of a business plan: 1-Problems and solutions, 2-Market targets and value propositions, 3-Business model presentation, and 4-Key points and indicators for measurement.

After sharing his knowledge, Dr. Khat Bora led the student groups in presenting their business models to the evaluation committee and assistant teachers. This practical session was a mock competition within the "2025 Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University College Entrepreneur Business Model Competition," which was both educational and enjoyable for all involved.

On September 9, 2025, His Holiness Samdech Preah Mahasangharajah Bour Kry, Rector of Preah Sihamoniraja Buddhist University and President of Samdech Royal Master Bour Kry Health Post of His Majesty King Sihamoni, graciously received Olivier Michel Marie Schmitthaeusler, Apostolic Vicar of the Catholic Church in Phnom Penh, who came to pay a respectful courtesy visit at Samdech Royal Master Bour Kry Health Post of His Majesty King Sihamoni.

During this meaningful occasion, His Holiness Bour Kry and the Bishop engaged in a cordial discussion focused on several key topics: (1) strengthening the relationship between Buddhism and the Catholic community in Cambodia;

(2) reinforcing interreligious harmony; (3) promoting cultural, faith-based, and religious exchanges; and (4) collaboration in the areas of education and healthcare. In addition, the bishop presented a donation of \$5,000 USD to His Holiness Bour Kry for purchase of medicine and medical supplies for treating underprivileged patients, and to support the operations of Samdech Royal Master Bour Kry Health Post of His Majesty King Sihamoni.

Furthermore, the Bishop recalled his long-standing and warm personal relationship with His Holiness Bour Kry, which has always been marked by mutual respect and deep affection. The two also discussed the broader context of interreligious harmony, emphasizing mutual respect among all religions,

non-discrimination, and peaceful coexistence. They highlighted the role of interfaith dialogue in building friendships, fostering solidarity, and promoting harmony through the universal principles of humanity, ethics, the four sublime states (brahmavihārā), and the four bases of social harmony (sanghahavatthu) as a foundation for peace and development.

His Holiness Samdech Preah Mahasangharajah Bour Kry particularly emphasized that religious wars are a tragic and destructive force that should never be allowed to happen in human society. He further recalled with appreciation the contributions of Catholic monks who had offered humanitarian aid and support to displaced people during the difficult period of the Cambodian—Thai conflict along the border, exemplifying acts of compassion and moral responsibility in times of hardship.

The bishop also expressed his heartfelt admiration at seeing Buddhism and Christianity Walk side by side, forming a shared moral force and collective movement to sustain and strengthen Cambodia's lasting peace. In conclusion, both His Holiness and the Bishop exchanged views on enhancing and expanding interreligious cooperation, with a focus on strengthening the relationship between Buddhism and the Catholic community in Cambodia, maintaining interreligious harmony, promoting cultural and religious exchanges, and advancing efforts in education and healthcare.

His Holiness Bour Kry encouraged the bishop to continue building a close and strong interreligious partnership between the two faith communities.

IMPROVING COMMUNICATION SKILLS: A PRESENTATION BY DR. STEVE COCHRANE












On Saturday, September 13, 2025, Dr. Steve Cochrane led a two-day international training program on improving communication skills. During his presentation on "Public Speaking," he covered four main topics: The definition of language, public communication methods, learning new skills, studying the English language. Dr. Cochrane highlighted that communication isn't just about what you say; it's also about your body language and emotions. In fact, he emphasized that body language is often more important than spoken words. He shared a breakdown of communication percentages: Body language: over 50%, Emotion and tone of voice: 40%, Grammar: 10%, Vocabulary and sound: less than 10%. Throughout his talk, Dr. Cochrane urged students to embrace learning new skills to grow personally and stay relevant in an evolving world. He stressed that this process requires time, patience, and practice. While mistakes are inevitable, he encouraged everyone to learn from them and use them as opportunities for improvement. "Don't be afraid to learn from your mistakes and enjoy learning new things," he advised. To conclude the training, Dr. Cochrane shifted from theory to practice. He shared effective methods for studying English and then guided students through their own English-language presentations. This hands-on experience allowed participants to immediately apply the public speaking techniques they had just learned. By the end of the two-day program, students left with more than just knowledge. They had sharpened their public speaking abilities, improved their English skills, and were newly inspired to continue their journey of lifelong learning.
