Cheating Policy

Policy owner: Academic Board

1. Purpose

To outline what constitutes cheating in examinations and assessments and how PSBU responds to it.

2. Scope

Applies to all forms of assessment, including written, oral, practical, and online formats.

3. Definition

Cheating is any dishonest act intended to gain unfair academic advantage. Examples include:

- Using unauthorised materials in an examination.
- Copying from or communicating with another candidate.
- Impersonating another student.
- Submitting falsified or fabricated data.
- Using generative AI or translation software to produce unacknowledged content.

4. Procedures

Invigilators or assessors must report suspected cases immediately.

The Registrar's Office logs all reports for investigation.

Students will be notified in writing and invited to respond to allegations.

The Faculty Integrity Panel reviews evidence and determines outcomes.

5. Education and Prevention

Students receive training on proper examination conduct and digital ethics.

Clear exam regulations are published each semester.
